WHY JAIPUR WORKS FOR PETS

Jaipur may be known for its palaces and forts, but a good pet holiday here is not about taking your dog inside every monument.

It is about discovering the city at a slower pace — scenic drives through the Aravallis, open landscapes around the forts, sunset viewpoints, garden spaces, heritage neighbourhoods and relaxed evenings at a pet-friendly resort.

The combination of wide-open surroundings, historic architecture, outdoor experiences and spacious properties makes Jaipur particularly enjoyable for dogs who like being outdoors.

And unlike a packed sightseeing itinerary, Jaipur allows you to balance exploration with plenty of hotel time, shaded breaks and unhurried walks.

PET-FRIENDLY EXPERIENCES

Amber Fort

Explore the impressive exterior, surrounding landscape and approach roads.

Best for: Heritage views, photography and a scenic outing rather than an indoor monument visit.

Jal Mahal

A beautiful roadside stop overlooking the palace in Man Sagar Lake.

Best for: Short walks, photographs and a relaxed drive-by experience.

Nahargarh Fort

Head into the hills for spectacular views over Jaipur.

Best for: Sunset, fresh air and panoramic landscapes.

Jaigarh Fort

A dramatic hilltop heritage experience overlooking the surrounding Aravallis.

Best for: Scenic drives, outdoor exploration and expansive views.

Patrika Gate

A colourful architectural stop that works well for a quick photograph with your pet.

Jawahar Circle

One of Jaipur's better open-air spaces for a relaxed walk and some time away from the city's bustle.

Panna Meena ka Kund

A beautiful historic stepwell near Amber.

Best for: A short heritage stop and photography.

Jaipur's Heritage Lanes & Outdoor Cafés

Slow walks through quieter heritage areas, followed by an outdoor café stop where pets are permitted.

Scenic Drives Around Jaipur

Some of Jaipur's best pet experiences happen between the attractions — especially around the Aravalli hills and old fort roads.

GETTING THERE WITH YOUR PET

Distance: Approx. 280–300 km from Delhi

Drive Time: Approximately 5½–7 hours

Recommended Route:

Delhi Gurugram Neemrana Behror Kotputli Jaipur

The route is predominantly highway and is relatively straightforward for a road trip with a pet.

Plan at least one proper break en route for water, a toilet break and a short walk.

Neemrana or the highway stops around Behror/Kotputli work well for breaking the journey.

Once you approach Jaipur, the landscape gradually changes from highway plains to the drier Aravalli surroundings — a nice transition into the Pink City.

PET NOTES

- Jaipur can get very hot, particularly outside the October–March season. Plan outdoor activities during mornings and late afternoons.
- Forts and heritage sites involve stone surfaces, stairs and uneven terrain, so comfortable pacing is important.
- Keep your pet leashed around roads, viewpoints, crowded areas and heritage sites.
- Avoid long walks on exposed stone or roads during the hotter parts of the day.
- Carry plenty of water, a portable bowl and basic cooling essentials.
- Sunset viewpoints such as Nahargarh can become busy, so keep your pet close in crowded areas.
- Jaipur's dry landscape can mean dust, sand and small stones getting into paws — check your pet after longer outdoor walks.
- Keep evenings relaxed rather than filling every available hour with sightseeing.
- A shaded garden, resort lawn or quiet outdoor café can sometimes be a better pet experience than another monument.

SUGGESTED PET-PACED ITINERARY

DAY 1 | DELHI JAIPUR

Drive from Delhi to Jaipur via Gurugram, Neemrana, Behror and Kotputli.

Take a proper break during the drive before continuing to Jaipur.

Check in to your hotel or resort and give your pet some time to settle in.

Evening

Head out for a relaxed visit to Jal Mahal and enjoy the view of the palace across the lake.

Return for a relaxed dinner and an early night.

The first evening is about arriving, settling in and letting Jaipur unfold slowly.

DAY 2 | AMBER • PANNA MEENA • JAIGARH • NAHARGARH

Start early and head towards the Amber area.

Morning

Visit Amber Fort and explore the exterior areas and surrounding landscape.

Continue to Panna Meena ka Kund for a short heritage stop.

Late Morning

Proceed to Jaigarh Fort and enjoy the hilltop views and surrounding Aravalli landscape.

Return to the hotel for an afternoon rest.

Let both you and your pet have some proper downtime.

Evening

Head towards Nahargarh Fort for sunset and panoramic views over Jaipur.

Return to the hotel for dinner.

Today is about forts, hills and big views — with a long afternoon pause in between.

DAY 3 | HERITAGE JAIPUR • PATRIKA GATE • JAWAHAR CIRCLE

Keep the morning relatively easy.

Explore Jaipur's heritage areas and City Palace surroundings, focusing only on sections where pets are permitted.

Take a relaxed lunch break.

Afternoon

Head towards Patrika Gate for photographs.

Continue to Jawahar Circle for an open-air walk and some relaxed outdoor time.

If your pet is comfortable, finish the evening with an outdoor café or heritage-lane walk where pets are permitted.

Less sightseeing. More wandering. This is Jaipur at an easier pace.

DAY 4 | SLOW MORNING DELHI

Enjoy a relaxed breakfast.

Give your pet time for one last walk around the property before checking out.

Begin the drive back to Delhi.

Take a proper highway break before continuing home.

The best souvenirs from a pet holiday are often muddy paws, sleepy dogs and a very tired passenger in the back seat.

DAY 5 | OPTIONAL EXTRA DAY

If you have a 4N/5D holiday, keep the fifth day intentionally light.

OPTION 1 | SAMODE

Take a scenic drive towards Samode and spend the day enjoying the countryside and heritage surroundings.

OPTION 2 | RESORT DAY

Stay back at the property.

Long garden walks.

Slow breakfast.

Afternoon nap.

A little exploring.

No timetable.

Sometimes the most pet-friendly day is the one where absolutely nothing needs to happen.

LUXURY | TAJ DEVI RATN RESORT & SPA

A luxury resort outside central Jaipur, offering a more spacious and relaxed setting than staying in the middle of the city.

Current traveller listings highlight the property as particularly pet-friendly.

Dedicated pet areas and pet-park facilities are noted.

Spacious surroundings make it especially suitable for dogs.

A good choice when the stay itself is meant to be part of the holiday.

Best for: Families travelling with dogs who want luxury, space and a resort-style pet holiday.

PREMIUM | DIGGI PALACE

A historic heritage property with beautiful gardens and plenty of character.

Heritage atmosphere with extensive garden spaces.

Particularly attractive for travellers with dogs.

Current traveller reviews specifically mention its suitability for pets.

The gardens provide a more relaxed environment than a typical city hotel.

Best for: Travellers who want Jaipur's heritage character without giving up outdoor space for their pet.

BUDGET | THE HOSTELLER BAM JAIPUR, HAWA MAHAL

A centrally located budget option for travellers who want to remain close to Jaipur's old-city attractions.

Central location.

Rooftop pool and terrace.

Convenient for travellers who prioritise location and budget over resort-style space.

Best for: Younger travellers and pet parents looking for an affordable central base.

PAPERBOAT PET TIP

Jaipur is not about taking your pet everywhere.
